Marine search and rescue on Lake Simcoe

On Saturday May 19th at approximately 5:30pm, South Simcoe Police received a call about three kayak's who were missing on Lake Simcoe. The Kayakers, all 12-years old youths had disappeared from the area of Innisfil Park.

Marine officers from the South Simcoe Police, York Regional Police and OPP conducted a search of the area with the assistance of the Canadian Coast Guard and located the youths. Police learned that the young men had decided to Kayak from Innisfil Park to Snake Island not realizing just how far it actually was. Police were happy to discover that all the youths, other than being tired, were in good physical condition and wearing lifejackets at the time.

Police want to remind boaters that conditions on Lake Simcoe can change rapidly and offer the following safety tips:

- File a boating plan with a marina, friend or family member, so you can be located quickly and efficiently should you run into difficulties
- Know the condition of the water before you go out and

take into consideration changing weather conditions that deteriorate rapidly and may have an effect on water conditions.

- Always know where your children are when around water; never leave children unattended.
- Don't fool yourself into thinking that your child would never go near the water without permission. Children react quickly to things and often don't recognize possible consequences.
- Wear life jackets at all times.
- Carry a cell phone to reach police in case of an emergency. Police boats are available to respond to emergencies at any time of the day or night.
- Wear proper floatation attire and clothing when participating in a water-related activity.
- Ensure that equipment and safety devices are in good working order, including having enough fuel, prior to venturing out onto the water.

Break and Enter

South Simcoe Police are investigating a break and enter to an apartment building garage on Holland St East in the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury. Person(s) unknown entered the garage through an unlocked door and removed a quantity of tools. The entry occurred sometime during the day on May 17, 2007. Police are interested in speaking with anyone who may have seen a turquoise mini van parked in the area.

Fail to Comply with Conditions

On May 18, at approximately 11:00p.m. South Simcoe Police investigated a vehicle in the area of Ewart St and Arnold St in the Town of Innisfil. Through investigation it was found that one of the occupants was failing to comply with a Judicial Interim Release by breaching a curfew. Police have charged a 19 year old Innisfil female with Fail to Comply with Conditions and she is being held in custody pending a bail hearing at WASH Court on May 19.

Assault

On May 19, at approximately 2:55a.m. South Simcoe Police attended a residence on Concession Road 12 in the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury after receiving

a call regarding a female who was injured from being pushed over a table. Upon arriving on scene, police arrested the husband for assault. Police have charged a 50 year old Bradford male with Assault.

Firearms

On Saturday May 19, at 3:00p.m. the complainant /victim in a road rage incident was threatened as a result. A handgun was displayed in the waistband of the accused pants while he was making threats to the victim.

Police located the suspect vehicle and all occupants were taken into custody. The handgun was a replica.

Five Toronto males between the ages of 16 and 22 years have been charged with the following offences; Weapons Dangerous, Utter Threats of Death, Possession of a controlled substance, Possession for the purpose of trafficking.

Four of the males were released on a Promise To Appear and an Undertaking entered into before an officer in charge.

One male is being held for a bail hearing scheduled for Sunday May 20.

Assault

On Saturday May 19th, at 10:28 pm the South Simcoe Police received a 911 call for assistance to a residential Street in Bradford regarding an assault. Investigation found that the complainant had been assaulted by an 18 year old Bradford man while trying to break up a fight between the accused and another male. The accused

was charge with assault and released on a promise to appear and an undertaking entered into before an officer in charge.

Assault investigation

On Saturday May 19th, at 11:30 pm the South Simcoe police Service received a 911 call to attend a cottage in Innisfil regarding a boyfriend and girlfriend domestic dispute. Officers arrested a 27 year old Toronto woman for assault with a weapon, assault, mischief under \$5000.00 and dangerous driving. The accused was released on a promise to appear and a undertaking entered into before an officer in charge.

Possession of Marijuana and Cocaine

On Saturday May 19th, at 8:40 pm South Simcoe Police Bicycle patrol officers investigated two youths in a parked vehicle outside of a house party on a residential street in Bradford. A 16 year old Innisfil youth and a 17 year old Bradford youth was arrested for possession of Cocaine and Marihuana. The youths were released on a promise to appear and an undertaking entered into before an officer in charge.

Breach of Undertaking

South Simcoe Police have charged a 17-year old youth with Breach of Undertaking, Breach of Probation, Assault Police and Assault with Intent to Resist Arrest after he was investigated by officers on bicycle patrol Sunday evening. The officers stopped the youth while he

was walking on Essa Street and discovered that he was intoxicated. Police attempted to arrest him for being drunk in a public place when he became aggressive and a brief struggle ensued resulting in one officer being injured. Further investigation revealed that the youth was already on both an Undertaking and a Probation Order with conditions that he not consumes alcohol. As a result, he was charged accordingly and held for bail on May 21st in Barrie.

Assault

A 28-year old Mississauga women is facing charges of Assault, Mischief and Dangerous Driving after a trip to the Cottage turned ugly on Saturday night. South Simcoe Police report the woman was visiting a friend's cottage on the 10th Line of Innisfil. At approximately 11:30pm she became involved in a heated argument with her ex-boyfriend who was also visiting for the weekend. During the argument, the accused hit and scratched the man in the face. She then left the cottage and proceeded to damage his vehicle, which was parked outside the cottage. Mutual friends attempted to calm her down, at which point she got into her vehicle and sped away almost striking two pedestrians in the area. She was arrested by police a short time later. She will be appearing in Bradford Court on June 28th, 2007.

Breach Undertaking

On May 16 a 41 yr old Bradford male and a 37 yr old Newmarket male were investigated as the result of a traffic stop on Simcoe Road in Bradford. Both men were found to be on conditions not to associate with each as the result of previous charges. Both men were charged with Breach of undertaking and held for bail. The Bradford male was further charged with Obstruct Police by providing a false name to the investigating officer.

Drive Disqualified

On May 16, a 44 year old male from Barrie was stopped while driving north on Yonge St north of Bradford. Investigation revealed that the male party was prohibited from driving as a result of a criminal code conviction. The male was charged with Drive disqualified under the criminal code along with other driving offences and his motor vehicle was impounded. The accused has a court date in June.

Fail to Attend Court

On May 17, South Simcoe Police arrested a 36 year old Toronto female who was wanted on a Bench Warrant for failing to appear in court on February 8, 2007. The female is charged with Fail to Attend Court and she is scheduled to appear in Bail Court later

this date.

Fail to Attend Court

South Simcoe Police have charged a 25 year old Bradford male with Fail to Attend Court. The male was scheduled to appear in court on May 17, 2007 at 8:30a.m.; the male was not present when his name was called in court and a bench warrant was issued for his arrest. The male showed up in court later in the day at which time he was arrested and taken into custody pending a bail hearing later this date.

Break and Enter - Residence

On May 17, South Simcoe Police attended a residence on Concession Road 5 in the Town of Innisfil regarding a break and enter. Sometime over the previous four days person(s) unknown forced their way into the residence and removed a quantity of Royal Doulton dolls and other items. The investigation is continuing.
