County building proves too small

Simcoe County council has given its approval to the purchase of two modular buildings to house its staff as its current building has insufficient space for its employees.

The purchase will cost of \$269,000.

The first building, which is 15,000 square feet in size, will be located on the county's Administration Centre property while the second smaller one, which is 5,000 square feet, will be located across the road besides the county archives.

About 20 employees will be relocated to the modular

buildings. County council turned down the options of either renting office space in Barrie or Midhurst or renting the modulars as not cost efficient in the long run.

The county's finance manager Tom Evans told councillors that the county would do better by buying the buildings and selling them afterwards.

Council will look at the long term solution to its space needs later this year. The county currently rents a wing of the building to Springwater Township which could be asked to relocate.
