## Canal Road driver unlicensed, still in hospital

On Saturday June 9th, at approximately 6:30am, South Simcoe Police received a 911 call reporting a single motor vehicle collision on Canal Road east of Simcoe Road in the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury.

Officers arrived within a few minutes to find that a westbound Pontiac Grand AM had lost control and struck a tree on the south side of the Holland River Canal. There was extensive damage to the vehicle and the driver was trapped inside with serious injuries.

Bradford West Gwillimbury Fire and Simcoe County EMS worked together to extricate the victim. Once

removed from the vehicle, the driver was transported to Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto by air ambulance.

Canal Road was closed for approximately 5 hours while a team of collision investigators reconstructed the accident.

The lone unlicensed male driver, 24, from Bradford, had struck a tree with the vehicle he was driving. Excessive speed and alcohol may have been contributing factors leading to the collision. As of 6:30pm on June 9th, the driver was listed in stable condition in hospital. His injuries are considered serious but non-life threatening.

### Sexual Assault/Mischief

On Wednesday June 6, at approximately 8:16 a.m. police were called to an Innisfil residence for a domestic dispute. Upon arrival, officers learned that a male had kicked in the front door to the residence after being unable to gain access. While investigating the mischief, the female also disclosed that her estranged common law husband had sexually assaulted her back in September 2006. As a result, a 35 year old Innisfil male was charged with Sexual Assault and Mischief to Property. He was held for a bail hearing on June 7, 2007.

### Drive Under Suspension

On Wednesday June 6, at approximately 2:14 p.m. police stopped a Chevrolet Lumina on the 10th Side Road of Bradford West Gwillimbury for speeding. As a result of an investigation, the officer learned that the driver, a 43 year old female from Dundas, was an unlicensed and suspended driver. It was also discovered that her vehicle was not insured. She was subsequently charged with two counts of Drive Under Suspension, Drive No Licence, and Operate Motor Vehicle on a Highway - No Insurance

### Assault

during a heated argument. As a result of an investigation, the male was arrested, charged with Assault, and held for a bail hearing later the same day.

### Search Warrant Executed

On Thursday June 7, the South Simcoe Police Service along with the Huronia Combined Forces Drug Unit executed a Controlled Drug and Substance Act search warrant at an Innisfil address. As a result, a small indoor cannabis marihuana grow operation was located along with several other marihuana plants outside. Growing equipment and cannabis marihuana were seized. A male party from Elliott Lake and a male party from Innisfil have been charged with Production of Cannabis Marihuana and Possession of Cannabis Marihuana.

Total value of the seizure, approximately \$150,000.00

### Fail To Comply

On Thursday June 7, police arrested and charged a 16 year old male with Failing To Comply after receiving several reports that he had gone missing from his residence. Investigation revealed the male was out on bail with a condition that he reside at an residence in Innisfil. Over the past two weeks the male had run away from his residence on several occasions. He was held for a bail hearing on June 8th.

### Uttering Threats

On Thursday June 7, the South Simcoe Police were called to an Innisfil address to investigate a threatening complaint. The female victim advised police that her ex boyfriend, a 16 year old male from Barrie, had been harassing her since they broke up several months earlier. On this date the boyfriend, along with another 17 year old male friend of his, called her residence and threatened to beat up her father and bomb his business. Police tracked down the suspects with the assistance of the Barrie Police. They were arrested and charged with Uttering Threats. The 16 year old male was also charged with Harassing Phone calls.

### Personal Injury Collision

A 42-year Innisfil women is facing charges of Careless Driving following a three vehicle collision on Yonge Street near the 10th Line of Innisfil which occurred on Saturday June 9th, at approximately 10:30am. Police report that southbound traffic on Yonge Street was stopped at the 10th Line waiting for a red traffic light. The women did not notice that traffic had stopped and rear-ended the car in front of her causing it to strike a third vehicle. The driver of the second vehicle received minor injuries but did not require medical attention.

## Crime of the Week

(Angus, Ontario - June 11th, 2007) Crime Stoppers of Simcoe-Dufferin-Muskoka and the Nottawasaga Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police are seeking the assistance of the public in helping to solve an occurrence involving a pellet gun in the village of Angus.

On June 4th, at approximately 7:15pm a 16 year old boy was walking along Corrie Crescent and was shot at with a pellet gun from a passing motor vehicle. The boy was skateboarding with a couple of 10 year old boys when he was shot in the hand. The boy was taken to hospital where a pellet was removed. The suspect vehicle is described as a green and beige Pontiac Montana passenger van. The suspect and driver is described as "Goth looking" approximately 19 years old, tall, thin, wearing dark clothing and short dark hair. There were also two females as passengers in the vehicle.

## Cyclist uninjured in hit and run

Essa Twp. — Nottawasaga OPP received a report of a hit and run that occurred on June 6th, at approximately 7:10 p.m. involving an elderly female and her husband out for a bike ride on County Road 56 in Essa.

The couple was heading southbound, when a white minivan or SUV came up from behind them and sideswiped the male on his bike. The passenger side mirror struck his elbow, causing him to almost fall.

After the hit, they observed a small 'after market' mirror that would have been affixed to the side mirror of the vehicle.

The vehicle was described as white minivan or SUV missing the passenger side small mirror and unfortunately no plate was obtained.

## Teen injured by pellet gun

Essa Twp. — Last Monday at approximately 7:15 p.m., a 16-year-old male was shot at with a pellet gun from a motor vehicle on Corrie Cres. in Angus and sustained injuries to his right hand.

The 16 yr old male was skateboarding with a couple of 10 year old boys on Corrie Cres, when a mini-van being operated by a male teenager shot at him and then fled in the vehicle. The 16 year old sustained minor injuries to his right hand. A pellet was extracted from it. He was treated and released from the hospital.

Although several witnesses were in the area, the identity of the suspect and the mini-van are unknown. The suspect vehicle is described as a Pontiac Montana passenger van -two tones - green on top/beige on bottom. Witnesses said they observed a pellet rifle in the front console of the van used in this incident.

Suspect and driver of the vehicle is described to be "goth looking", 19 yrs, thin, tall, dark tight clothing and short dark hair. The vehicle also contained two female occupants, both with brown hair, one sporting a lip ring. The investigation is continuing.

Police are asking anyone who may have witnessed any incidents described above where no suspects have been identified or where an investigation is continuing or anyone who has any information regarding these incidents, to contact Nottawasaga OPP at 905-729-4004 or Crime stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477).
