Aggravated Assault on Canal Road during 400 closure

On Monday, June 18, 2007 at approx 3:30 p.m. the South Simcoe Police Service responded to a stabbing that occurred on Canal Road in the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury. Investigation to this point has revealed that two vehicles became involved in an incident on Canal Road east of Hwy # 400.

Both vehicles ended up in a lot on Canal Road at which time the driver of the first vehicle who is the accused in this matter and the passenger of the second vehicle who is the victim both exited their respective vehicles. The two males then became involved in a verbal and physical altercation resulting in the accused stabbing the victim.

The male victim was airlifted to Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto and is suffering non-life threatening injuries.

The accused, a 32 year old Barrie man was arrested a short time after this incident and will be held for a Bail Hearing.

The accused is facing Charges of Aggravated Assault, Weapons Dangerous to Public Peace, and Dangerous

Driving.

Request for Assistance from Public

During this Incident the accused was driving a 2006 Beige/Brown Toyota Corolla 4 Dr car and towing a empty small utility trailer.

Investigation has revealed that just prior to the assault, in the same location on Canal Road just east of Hwy #400 Bradford West Gwillimbury the accused vehicle was involved in a confrontation with several other vehicles while driving E/B on Canal Rd.

The South Simcoe Police are requesting that the driver and/or passenger of a Blue/Green van that engaged the accused vehicle contact the South Simcoe Police Criminal Investigation Bureau. This person(s) is considered a witness to these events.

The South Simcoe Police are requesting that any other persons who may have witnessed the driving or the assault contact the South Simcoe Police Criminal Investigation Bureau at 905-775-3311.

Cross with Care campaign

The first week of the South Simcoe Police "Cross with Care" safety campaign has wrapped up. Officers have been assigned to monitor both vehicular and pedestrian traffic in and around pedestrian cross walks in the downtown areas of Bradford. The following are the statistics for the

campaign thus far.

Vehicle Charges : 47

Vehicle Cautions: 75

Pedestrian Cautions: 31

The campaign will continue to run for another two weeks. Officers have been reminding pedestrians and motorists alike of the rules of road

when it comes to pedestrian cross walks. Even with the heavy police presence, two motorists still did not get the message. Both were charged with speeding in the pedestrian cross walk. One was clocked at 90 km/h and the other at 98 km/h in a posted 50 km/h zone.

Theft from Motor Vehicles - Bradford

Breach of Recognizance - Innisfil

South Simcoe Police have arrested a 58 year old Innisfil for the 3rd time in 3 months for Breaching Conditions of his Release while on Bail. The male was found at an Alcona

residence in breach of his residency and curfew requirements.

Male was initially arrested in March 2007 on numerous Drug and Assault charges.

Breach of Undertaking

On Friday June 15, at approximately 1:30 a.m. an officer from the South Simcoe Police Service was patrolling a residential area in Gilford regarding a suspicious persons call.

At this time he observed a male riding a bicycle in the vicinity and stopped him to investigate.

Investigation revealed the male was on an undertaking for drug charges with a condition to maintain a curfew between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. daily.

He was arrested for Breach of Undertaking and held for a bail hearing

Trespass by Night /Mischief

On Friday June 15, at approximately 2:50 a.m. police were called to an Innisfil residence for an

unwanted female. Officers arrived and learned that a 22 year old female from Newmarket had attended without invitation to the residence of her ex boyfriend's new girlfriend. Officers cautioned her and sent her on her way.

A short time later the female returned to the residence and attempted to gain entry through a window air conditioner.

Police were called back to the residence and arrested the female. She was charged with Trespass by Night and Mischief to Property and held for bail.

Assault

On June 17 South Simcoe Police responded to a possible suicide attempt involving a 59 year old Innisfil female. Police determined that there had been an assault that had taken place earlier in the day and the female had been the victim.

A 64 year old Innisfil male was arrested and charged with assault. The female was treated at hospital and released.

Impaired Driving/ Possession of a Controlled Drug

On Friday June 8, at approximately 1:10 a.m. a South Simcoe Police officer was on general patrol on the 10th Line of Bradford West Gwillimbury when he came upon a vehicle parked on the side of the road.

Upon further inspection the officer located a male passed out behind the wheel of the vehicle.

The officer awoke the male and arrested him for impaired driving.

A further search of his vehicle located a quantity of cocaine and magic mushrooms.

The driver, a 25 year old Bradford male, was transported to the station for breath tests. He was charged with Impaired Driving, Over 80 mgs, and two counts of Possession of a Controlled substance.

Warrant executed

On Sunday June 10th at approx. 8:30 p.m. the South Simcoe police attended to York Regional Police Service in Vaughan to pick up a male who had an outstanding warrant since 2004 for Impaired driving and fail to appear in court. York Regional Police attended to a disturbance

Summerfest incidents

RIDE Program

On Friday June 15, The South Simcoe Police Service conducted a RIDE Program at Innisfil Beach Road and St. John's Road in the Town of Innisfil in conjunction with the Innisfil Summerfest activities taking place at Innisfil Beach Park.

A total of 300 vehicle were stopped, which resulted in 7 road side tests, 2 - 12 hour licence suspensions, 3 Highway Traffic Act charges, 7 Liquor Licence Act charges, and 2 charges under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. 7 cautions were also given for various minor infractions.

Liquor Acts

The South Simcoe Police investigated a number of liquor infractions as a result of the Innisfil Summerfest activities as Innisfil Beach Park during the evening of June 15th.

Two intoxicated males were arrested for their own safety and held until sober, and a couple of liquor seizures were made by police in, or near Innisfil Beach Park

Theft

On Friday June 15, police attended a residence in Innisfil on the shore of Lake Simcoe for a report of a theft. The complainant advised police that he had both radios stolen out of his boats that were docked on the water at his property.

Both were identified as Clarion A/M CD players. One of the boats also had both leather seats removed as well as its life jackets, flares, and oars. Police are investigating.

Over 80 mgs

On 16 June, South Simcoe Police were conducting a RIDE program on Innisfil Beach Rd in Alcona. A 41 yr old Innisfil male was stopped driving a motor vehicle and it was determined that he had been drinking. The driver was given a Roadside Screening Device and registered a FAIL.

The Accused was transported to the South Simcoe Police North Division where a breathalyzer revealed that the Accused was over the legal limit and the Accused was charged with Impaired Over 80 and now has a court date in July.

The driver was also issued a 90 day drivers licence suspension.

call in Vaughan and located the male with a few of his friends parting a little to loudly.

Officers investigated the male in question and found that there was a warrant outstanding for his arrest in South Simcoe.

Officers escorted the 37 year old male who now resides in York Region back to the South Simcoe Police station where he will attend court on Monday morning.

Personal Injury Collision

A 45-year old Innisfil cyclist was transported to Royal Victoria Hospital with minor head injuries after he disobeyed a stop sign on the 4th Line at Yonge Street on Saturday morning at approximately 10:00am. Police report the man entered into the intersection without stopping and was struck by a southbound car

on Yonge Street.

The investigation is continuing.

Assault

On Monday, June 11th, at approx. 8:00 p.m. the South Simcoe Police were contacted advising that two neighbours were fighting at a residence in

Alcona in the Town of Innisfil. Police attended and spoke to witnesses advising that the two neighbours were arguing over property issues in which ended up turning into a fight. Police arrested both parties.

The first male, a 36 year old Alcona man was arrested for Uttering death threats and assault.

The second male a 45 year old Alcona man was also arrested for assault. Both individuals have a court date in July.
