SSP busy over holiday weekend

The officers attend personal injury motor vehicle collision on Friday afternoon at the 25 th Side Road and 13 Line of Innisfil in which a Markham man 51 years of age had failed to yield to through traffic in his Mazda van and was struck by a southbound truck and trailer driven by a local resident. The passenger in the van was transported to Royal Victoria Hospital with a possible broken arm along with a younger female who was examined for a minor back injury. The Markham man was subsequently charged under the Highway Traffic Act. He had just arrived in the area to commence his vacation with his family when this accident occurred.

There were also two other serious motor vehicle collisions over the weekend, one being at the 10 Side Road and Lockhart Road and another 1 July 2007 at the 20th Side Road and Lockhart Road in Innisfil. Persons involved were transported to hospital with non life threatening injuries.

Police were also involved in cottage patrol on our North / South Roadways in the South Simcoe Police jurisdiction, focusing on speeding and aggressive drivers. As a result there were over 100 Highway Traffic Act Charges laid in three days.

Marine Unit was kept very busy to due cooler temperatures and high winds. There were four Marine Search and Rescue calls over the weekend including a 14 year old boy who was located in a Kayak.

He was not a strong paddler and attempted to cross the Lake in Cooks Bay area in large waves. He was subsequently located by our police vessel and returned to his

parent and grandfather at their cottage in a safe condition. He was wearing his life jacket at the time of the incident. There was also a sailing vessels that was taking on water and became grounded with four persons on board . The police vessel took these persons to safety and assisted in safely securing the vessel from further damage. Another incident took place near Thorah Island were a vessel capsized and our vessel responded to assist Durham and York Regional Police Marine Units.

The occupants of this vessel were located and taken to safety by police.

Police remind all boaters that when high winds occur on Lake Simcoe venturing out can be treacherous for even the most experienced boaters.

Please be cautious and use your common sense before leaving your cottage or marina in these conditions.

Fortunately, no serious injuries or fatalities occurred over this weekend.

Police continued routine patrol and equipment safety checks over the month of June on Lake Simcoe and the following statistics were obtained by the Marine Unit:

Suspect saught in alleged dog dragging

The Barrie SPCA is asking for the public's help in locating a man involved with an alleged dog dragging. On June 28 the Barrie SPCA received an anonymous call reporting a dog being dragged on Penvill Trail in Barrie. It's a residential area right beside hiking trails popular with walkers and their dogs.

According to the caller, a man was seen beating his shepherd type dog when the dog was not obeying commands following their walk in this area. The man then got into his car and proceeded to drag the dog by holding the leash out of the driver's side window. After the dog had been dragged a short distance and was bleeding, the driver stopped the vehicle and put the dog into the car and drove off.

The suspect is described as a male caucasian between 25-30 years old, medium build, approx. 6 feet tall. He has a shaved head with a black tribal type tattoo on his neck. He was using yellow nylon type rope to leash his dog that was wearing a black collar. The dog is described as a mid size shepherd type dog approximately 60 pounds, black and tan in colour. The dog may now have large open wounds and be missing fur.

The vehicle is described as a red older model sedan. If you have any information on this incident you are asked to contact the investigations department at the Barrie SPCA.

Possession of Marijuana

South Simcoe Police Bike Patrol Officers were patrolling the Alcona area and came upon 4 youths near the Innisfil Library, Alcona Branch at approximately 10:00 pm, June 29. Youths were engaged in using marijuana and had other drug paraphernalia with them. One of the youths was found to have approximately 25 grams of marijuana on him which he attempted to hide from the officers. A 16 year-old Alcona male has been charged Possession of Marijuana contrary to the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.

Mischief to Property

On Sunday July 1, at approximately 12:50 a.m. police received a call to attend an elementary school in Stroud for a report of a possible break in. Officers attended and met security who had responded to an alarm at the school and found that a window in a door on the east side of the building had been smashed. Nothing was taken, and it is unsure of the culprits entered the building. Police are investigating.

On Sunday July 1, at approximately 10:30 p.m. police were called back to the school for a second broken window that had been located. Officers attended and found a broken window in an east side door. Nothing appeared to have been taken from the school.

Impaired Driving

On Sunday July 1, at approximately 6:10 p.m. police responded to a motor vehicle collision at the 5th Side Road and the 10th Concession of Innisfil. Police attended and arrested one of the driver's for Impaired Driving. He was transported to the station where he provided a breath sample that was just 6 mgs under the legal limit. As a result, he was issued a 12 hour licence suspension, and charged under the Highway Traffic Act with Failing to Yield to Traffic on a Through Highway.

Robbery/Forcible Confinement/Breach of Conditions

The South Simcoe Police have arrested and charged a

26 year old female from Bradford with Robbery, Forcible Confinement and three counts of Breach of Probation after an investigation. Police received a complaint from a female that she was robbed of her cell phone at knife point and held against her will at a Bradford residence on June 27. Police located the suspect on June 30th while investigating an unrelated incident and arrested her. In the course of their investigation, officers discovered the suspect had also breached three different conditions of her probation order that was issued as a result of previous charges.


Public Intoxication

On Saturday June 30, at approximately 8:40 p.m. police were called to a Bradford Bar by a female who indicated there was a disturbance and she needed help. Officers arrived and located the female. Police determined that no disturbance had taken place and observed the female was intoxicated. She was arrested and held in custody until sober. She was charged with Public Intoxication and released the following morning.

Breach of Probation/ Obstruct Police/ Weapons Dangerous

On Monday July 2nd, officers from the South Simcoe Police Service were patrolling the 7th Line of Innisfil at Lake Simcoe after they had received several ongoing complaints of youths loitering in the area.

At approximately 8:00pm, uniformed officers located a group of young teens consuming alcohol in the immediate area. One of the youths, a 14-year old Innisfil teen, falsely identified herself to officers during the investigation. The youth is known to police and one of the officers recognized her and knew she was lying about her identity. Officers also knew that she was on several outstanding probations orders, including a condition that prohibited her from consuming any alcohol. As a result, she was placed under arrest for Breach of Probation and Obstructing Police. When the officers searched her, they discovered a homemade weapon concealed in her clothing. The weapon was similar to a baton used by police
